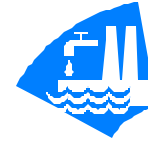


**ANNOUNCING A BPC EDUCATIONAL SEMINAR**

Continuing development activity - and economic prosperity - in the Bay Area depend on a reliable and available water supply. While the construction of conventional water system projects is necessary to meet projected water demands, ensuring the Bay Area’s future water supply will require maximum water use efficiency, which includes water recycling. Although there have been success stories with water recycling, the Bay Area continues to lag behind many other areas of the State and the nation in the amount of waste water it recycles. Why?

This one-half day seminar will address the challenges of water recycling. A collection of experts in the water recycling industry will present their views on the challenges and obstacles that continue to confront sanitary districts and water agencies throughout the Bay Area as they attempt to stretch the region's precious water supplies. What conceptually appears to be a "no-brainer," has, in practice, been far from a "slam-dunk" in many cases. Failing to solve this dilemma may ultimately threaten the region's ability to meet its quality of life and economic growth goals.
